Why can email attachments be dangerous?

communications

- Email is easily circulated Forwarding email is so simple that viruses can quickly infect many machines. Most viruses do not even require users to forward the email they scan a users' mailbox for email addresses and automatically send the infected message to all of the addresses they find.
- Email programs try to address all users' needs Almost any type of file can be attached to an email message, which gives attackers more freedom in sending viruses.
- Email programs offer many "user-friendly" features Some email programs have the option to automatically download email attachments, which immediately exposes your computer to viruses within the attachments.

How to protect yourself and others in your address book:

- Be wary of unsolicited attachments, even from people you know. Just because an email message looks like it came from someone you know does not mean that it did. Many viruses can "spoof" the return address, so if possible, check with the sender to make sure it's legitimate before opening any attachments.
- Keep software up-to-date. Install software patches so attackers can't take advantage of known problems or vulnerabilities. Many operating systems offer automatic updates. If this option is available, you should enable it.

- *Trust your instincts.* If an email or email attachment seems suspicious, don't open it, even if your antivirus software indicates that the message is clean. At the very least, contact the sender to make sure it's legitimate before you open the attachment. If something about the email or the attachment makes you uncomfortable, don't give in to your curiosity.
- Save and scan any attachments before opening them. If you must open an attachment before you can verify the source, take the following steps:
 - 1. Update the signatures in your antivirus software.
 - 2. Save the file to your computer or a disk.
 - 3. Manually scan the file using your antivirus software.
 - 4. Open the file if it's clean and doesn't seem suspicious.
- Turn off the option to automatically download attachments. Many email programs offer the feature to automatically download attachments. Check your settings to see if your software offers the option, and disable it.
 - Consider creating separate accounts on your computer. Most operating systems offer multiple-user accounts with different privileges. Your emails can be read on an account with restricted privileges. Some viruses need "administrator" privileges to infect a computer.
 - Apply additional security practices.
 You may be able to filter certain types of attachments through your email software or a firewall.
