What to Know About Phishing, Vishing, and Smishing

To outsmart criminals, stay informed about common threats:

Phishing – It's an email that appears to be from your financial institution or another company with which you do business. It asks you to click a link that takes you to a legitimate-looking webpage, where you're directed to enter information such as your account number, password, or Social Security number. Don't bite! It's a scam to steal your personal data. Reputable companies never gather information this way.

Vishing – This is phishing over the phone—the "v" is for voice. The criminals call you, claiming to be from your bank or another institution you trust (such as the local court system calling about jury duty). As in phishing, they're after your personal information. Simply hang up.

Smishing – Short for SMS phishing, smishing uses text messages to lure you into clicking fraudulent links or download infected apps on your phone. Never respond to text messages or automated voice messages from unknown numbers on your mobile phone.
